Special discounts are also available for Ph.D. students, academics and members of the media. Please inquire with us.

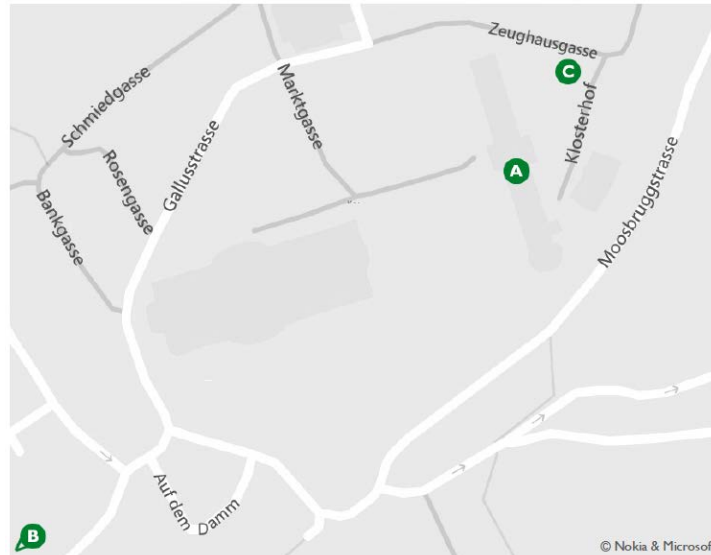
Hotel Reservations
